

Info session in Atlantic City for Sandy recovery program participants

ATLANTIC CITY — Gov. Chris Christie has announced that an information session will be offered to provide personal assistance for homeowners affected by Hurricane Sandy who are participating the RREM and LMI homeowners programs.

The information session will take place from 4 to 7 p.m. Jan. 27 at the All Wars Memorial building on Adriatic Avenue in Atlantic City, the governor said in a news release. The session will provide individualized assistance to help eligible Rehabilitation, Reconstruction, Elevation and Mitigation Program and Low to Moderate Income Program participants with any questions or issues.

The session is open to eligible program participants from the nine counties determined to have been most affected by the storm, including Atlantic, Cape May and Ocean counties, the release said.

“Whether participants are nearing completion on the rebuilding or elevating of their storm-damaged home or are in the process of selecting their contractor, we will have knowledgeable staff available to field their questions,” said New Jersey Department of Community Affairs Commissioner Charles A. Richman.

Representatives from the DCA’s Sandy Recovery Division and Housing Recovery Centers as well as RREM program managers will be available to answer questions. Representatives from the New Jersey Division of Consumer Affairs also will attend, as will housing counselors from the Sandy Recovery Housing Counseling Program.

Information will be available on the Rental Assistance Program launched in March to help Sandy-affected families pay for temporary housing. Through this program, homeowners in the RREM and LMI programs who have signed a grant agreement and meet other eligibility criteria can seek as much as \$1,300 per month for as many as nine months of rental assistance, the release said.
