

New affordable housing to be built for Sandy-impacted residents

The state Housing and Mortgage Finance Agency recently committed more than \$180 million in federal Hurricane Sandy funds to create about 1,500 housing units across the state — most of which will be affordable.

Locally, there will be six affordable housing projects in Atlantic County totaling 524 units. The largest of these will be The Beach at South Inlet project, which will make 250 new units in Atlantic City. Three of the projects will be in Absecon, two will be in Atlantic City and one will be in Egg Harbor Township.

In Ocean County, a 70-unit senior housing project called Barnegat Sr. Apartments will be built in Barnegat.
